We also have a very vibrant Pantry that serves over 100 families per month. Our garden also includes this wonderful building that hosts numerous events for local groups. It includes our staff that presents our weekly worship in person and online. The garden includes our weekly M@M meetings as well as the Sunday school before service each week.

We have been very fortunate this year that the returns from our investments have kept pace with our current budgeted spending. We cannot rely on that to continue each year. We are asking that you prayerfully consider your pledge (seed) for 2022 and return the enclosed pledge card or submit your pledge online.
